Dr. John Hummel is the director of clinical electrophysiology research and a professor of clinical medicine at The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center. He was named one of America's Best Doctors in 2008, 2009 and 2010 and, more recently, rated in the top 10 percent of physicians in the nation for patient satisfaction in 2014, 2015. Dr. Hummel's specialties (or conditions he treats) include: Clinical Cardiac Electrophysiology; Cardiac Electrophysiology; Arrhythmias, Cardiac; Catheter Ablation; Pacemaker, Artificial; Defibrillators, Implantable; Device Removal; Atrial Fibrillation; Bradycardia; Cardiac Resynchronization Therapy Devices; Electric Countershock; Syncope; Syncope, Vasovagal; and Coronary Care Units.

Rosalie Ungar is a 35 year Atrial Fib patient and author of a memoir In A HEARTBEAT: The Ups and Downs of Life with Atrial Fib. Mrs. Ungar tells her riveting story from a patient's point of view. Rosalie had a heart attack seventeen years ago and has struggled (and triumphed over) Atrial Fib. Doctors at OSU say that she has reversed all heart damage from 2 heart attacks and at 79 years old feels better mentally and physically than she has in over 15 years.
